Regular Monthly Meeting
April 4, 2013

Presiding: Jeff Senten

Members Present: Elizabeth Parkinson, Jeff Senten, Mel Palfreyman, Starr Campbell, Jodi Strader , LaDell Bishop, and Russ Dobesh, Jeff Larson, Boyd Smith and Matthew Hurst.

Meeting was called to order at 7:02 pm with 30 citizens in attendance. Mel Palfreyman offered a payer. Jeff Senten led the meeting in the Pledge of Allegiance.

Starr gave report on Todd. On March 11 Todd went into hospital due to heart complications. After almost losing his life twice, he has been through many tests that resulted in determining that his left ventricle was no good. He has had surgery to have a mechanical heart to sustain him until he can receive a heart transplant. Todd and Carolyn will need to move into the smaller house currently occupied by their son and need to move their son into the home they occupy. He is expected to be able to return home in two weeks. Jeff Larsen gave a report of the needed renovations to the home. Various items have been donated to help in restoration. Help is needed in moving efforts and Hearts for Todd has been established on facebook to help with medical costs.

Minutes for the March meeting was presented, Mel Palfreyman made a motion to accept the minutes as presented, Starr Campbell Seconded. Motion passed.

Committee Reports:

1. Public & Government Relations (Kelly Killpack): Kelly not available due to work.

Arts Council – Wes Furgason: Orchestra and choir getting close to their performance. May 7th performance will be at the senior center and May 9th at Matheson Jr. High. Zap grant paperwork is now complete.

Starr reported on relay for life. Kickoff had minimal turnout but still was great fun. Team captain meeting experience will be the last Thursday in April. American Cancer Society will be moving West Valley relay to Taylorsville.

Elizabeth Parkinson reported on 4th of July. Logo has been chosen and the fireworks contract is complete. They will be selling unlimited wristbands for \$10.00 that will include both days. Thursday events will be from 1pm to 10pm and Friday will be from 5pm to 9pm. Security help is needed. We are now excepting vendor's applications.

Mel gave a report for Magna FACT Norm Fitzgerald scholarship fund. On the 28th of May the scholarship will be presented. They will be interviewing both the parents and the student to make their decision. Boyd made motion to grant up to \$1,000 scholarship and Starr seconded. Motion passed provided that it is verified by Todd that funds are available.

Planning & Zoning (Jeff Larson): Nancy brought Max Johnson, planning supervisor to clear up any questions from last month's meeting. Review was done about the proposed Family Dollar. They have proceeded with the plans for building, understanding the concerns from the last council meeting. Concern was shared that the council has little say as to projects such as this that concern our community. Planning commission meets the 2nd Thursday of the month at 6:30. Storm drain situation at 8400 situation was discussed. There is a flood control permit. It is not drinking water and there is a storm drain.

Movies in the Park discussion was made in regard to the help needed in Todd's absence. Elizabeth committed her husband with the ability to bring the movie trailer.
