Regular Monthly Meeting
June 05, 2014

Meeting was called to order at 7:00 pm with 25 citizens in attendance. Matthew Hurst offered a payer. Ben Hurst led the meeting in the Pledge of Allegiance.

Minutes for the meeting were presented. Matt Hurst made a motion to accept the minutes as presented, Kelly Killpack seconded. Motion passed.

Committee Reports:

1. Public & Government Relations (Kelly Killpack): Nothing to report

Arts Council – (Wes Furgason): Orchestra and choir performances went well. Music in the park will be Friday of next week. Todd Green will be coming to play many different instruments to approximate what different cultures would sound like.

4th of July – (Elizabeth Parkinson/Carolyn Richards): Carolyn stated that the next meeting. They are asking for more help from everyone especially for the 4th itself. LaDell suggested that they reach out to Kohl's Department Store due to the company encouraging volunteering in the community.

2. Bark for Life (Starr Campbell): Going ahead like it should. She also talked about Miss Magna. Information is on Face Book. It will be held on the 28th of June at the Magna Senior Center.

3. Schools, Library & Recreation (Tory Allred): Trish spoke about reading club starting. She asked that the information be forwarded to her on the Miss Magna pageant so that the Chamber can put it on their web site.

4. Health, Welfare & Environment (Jeff Senten / Russ Dobesh): Nothing to report.

Special Reports

Presentation started by Matt Hurst (2972 S 7750 W.) to introduce his son Ben Hurst. Ben is looking for a donation from the council to fund a project that he is working on for his Eagle Scout project. He wishes to get enough money to build 5-7 picnic tables for some of the local parks. These will be 6 foot wooden tables that will be cemented in. He will be working with Teri from parks and recreation. He is looking for \$500.00 to \$600.00 total from both the town council and the community council.

Public Comments: Robert Goble (3053 S.8400 W.) has come to comment on the banners that are on Magna Main Street. He states that the dates given on the banners are incorrect for the town founding. The town was named in 1869 and established in 1874 He has done some research for a book that he is writing on Pleasant Green and has found the correct date. He is moving to get new banners to reflect the proper date. Greg will be sending an email to the proper channels to get the proper date reflected the next time the banners are printed.

County & Community Reports:

1. West Township Representative (Greg Schulz): Next Tuesday the people will be announced that will sit on the Mayor's new committee. The two people selected are Representative Duckworth, and Bennion Gardner. Everyone who put in an application is going to be asked to be on some committee.

2. Planning & Zoning (Jeff Larsen): Mike from code enforcement gave a report of all of the areas they have been working to keep clean for the area. He asked that we give reports of weed enforcement. Discussion was made on the area on 8000 W. and just off of 3500 S. Jodi Strader suggested that concrete be put in the area due to the lack of access to water. Discussion was made about the moth and box elder bug infestation. He suggested that a list of volunteers be created to help when seniors or those with limited income need yard work done for code enforcement. Also review was made regarding fairness of code enforcement in various areas in Salt Lake County.

2. U. P. D. (Chief. Steve Anjewierden): Introduced himself as the new Chief. He believes in community support and that the community is an active partner in law enforcement. Josh Wolfenden was presented the Sheriff's star for going above and beyond when the Lady of Lord's case when they were robbed and vandalized. The chief also asked for assistance for a letter of support as they work to get a grant with the Department of Health to get a program to go where kids gather and outreach to them in after school activities to try to reduce violence. Ryan Wolfe presented the council with a certificate of appreciation to the council for their support.

3. Luz Robles presented herself. She is the current Senator for district 1. She has served as Senator for the last 6 years. Due to restructuring of the voting boundaries she now serves part of Magna. She is currently running for congress. She overviewed some of the bills that she has helped to create and some she has supported. She has focused on gang prevention, veterans, and fighting for the rights of fathers and other parent's rights issues. She apologized for not coming sooner.

4. U. F. A.: (Doug Hannay): Nothing to report

5. A.C.C.T.: (LaDell Bishop): A projected list of next year's calendar is needed.

6. Finance Committee (Todd Richards): Financial Statement (See report attached): Jodi Strader made a motion to allow a continuance of the payment for the web site maintenance for the rest of the year, LaDell Bishop seconded, motion passed. A motion was made by Russ Dobesch and Kelly Killpack to allow up to \$300.00 in support for the previously mentioned Scout project. The motion passed.

7. Presidents Report (Jeff Senten) Starr gave a report in his behalf reviewing the Youth Academy support that we gave to pay for food. She highlighted El Habanero and Ken's sandwich shop that gave us good deals and called out for people to support those businesses. Starr will be writing thank you cards to those businesses. She spoke of the support we gave to the Fallen Brother's event. She has seen that the balloon release that was done meant a lot to the families that took part. Halloween in summer is in need of a letter from the town council to assist them in getting approval for them to have a beer garden in a vacant lot area that is by Bill's Lounge. Letter is needed to help to get the proper permits approved. Discussion was made on the exact wording of the letter. Starr has committed to writing the letter.
